


COLORADO ATTORNEY GENERAL 2016 FELLOWSHIP PROGRAM

ABOUT THE PROGRAM

The Colorado Attorney General's Office serves the public through its seven sections: Business & Licensing, Civil Litigation & Employment Law, Criminal Justice (which includes the Appellate Division), Consumer Protection, Natural Resources & Environment, Revenue & Utilities, and State Services. Selected Fellows are assigned to two sections and receive exposure to a broad range of subject matter.

Fellows substantially develop their legal skills by engaging in substantive work under the mentorship of practicing attorneys. Fellows' experiences are different and tailored to each Fellow's particular interests and skills, allowing them to develop proficiency in particular practice areas. Fellows may assist attorneys in providing client advice and participating in client meetings, drafting agreements and other legal documents, preparing pleadings, and participating in depositions, hearings, or trials. Every Fellow will have an opportunity to draft an appellate brief. Over the course of the year, Fellows are expected to assume considerable individual responsibility for their work.

ELIGIBLE CANDIDATES

The Colorado Attorney General’s Office seeks applications for its Fellowship Program from:

- Law students in their final year at an accredited law school scheduled to graduate in the Spring of 2016.
- Current, full-time judicial law clerks who received their J.D. prior to 2016.

The Fellowship Program begins October 2016. All individuals invited to participate must commit to a one-year term and must take the Colorado bar exam no later than July 2016.

(Bar passage is required to join the program in October 2016.)

The annual salary is \$50,000.

APPLICATION PROCESS

Applicants must submit the following required materials no later than November 13, 2015. Selected candidates will be invited for interviews.

1. One-page statement or cover letter explaining your commitment to public interest law and the sections for which you are interested in working as a Fellow;
2. OFFICIAL law school transcript;
3. Contact information for three professional references;
4. Resume; and
5. Unedited writing sample (6-page limit, please).
